#### Guest Speaker: Jennifer McKenzie, Trustee, OCDSB

Chair of the Board's French Second Language Ad Hoc Committee Secondary Phase of the French as a Second Language (FSL) Review

- Jennifer outlined the 4 objectives of the French as a Second Language (FSL) Review:
  - a) **Quality of Program**-to improve the effectiveness of delivery & instruction
  - b) **Equity**-to ensure that all students throughout the school district have equitable access to FSL programs
  - c) **Viability** ensure that FSL programs have viable & sustainable enrolments
  - d) Financial ensure that FSL programs are cost effective
- At the elementary level, the committee looked at data across our board, from other boards across the country and did extensive surveys with parents and teachers.
- The FSL, Elementary Phase, Review Committee also looked at the time allocation model as there was a wide discrepancy amongst schools.
- At present there are 50 52% students entering EFI at the kindergarten level but only 15% of high school students choosing French diploma options in high school.
- A review of FSL programs at the secondary level will begin this fall. The process will be the same as at the elementary level.
- At the high school level, surveys are being given to high school teachers regardless of their teaching assignment. These are to be completed in October. Surveys will also be sent to students, but will not be given to parents for this review. Jennifer did acknowledge that it is intended to have input from the Secondary School Committee. Staff will administer the survey to students in class.
- Results will be analyzed by December 2008 with a report detailing the results of the survey submitted to Education Committee by January, 2009. Implementation of changes to the secondary FSL programs will begin in September, 2009.
- Discussion followed which included: i) How do you measure proficiency? ii) Funding at federal government level iii) How do you

measure the quality of instruction and concern about the lack of qualified French teachers iv) Feeling by parents that children of anglophone parents being disadvantaged v) Funding discrepancy between boards vi) Recognize that we are an English school board vii) Questioned whether we gear our education to what parents want versus what educators consider best practices.

• OCDSB has asked to pilot a proficiency test (Canadian). The Canadian Parents for French group has asked to use the existing Ottawa model for proficiency.

#### Chalk-It-Up

- As a follow-up to motion brought forth by Glebe in May regarding funding for new Grade 9 and 10 Math and Science textbooks, it was decided that there weren't any real concerns at other schools. Therefore, no further action will be taken. However, there was a discussion that courses will be changing and that textbooks may become an issue again. Question was raised as to whether there will be special funding for textbooks in 2009.
- Beth Doubt reported from SEAC that this committee was not formed to deal with individual cases, but to give general information regarding special education and to give contact names where appropriate. It was felt that it would be beneficial to have some kind of forum specifically allocated to special education issues. SEAC will host a forum prior to each OCASC meeting beginning at 6:15 pm. The first forum well be in November before the OCASC meeting at the Board. School councils are encouraged to attend.
- Sir Robert Borden is hosting a presentation on Thursday, November 6 at 7:00 p.m which is open to all parents. A flyer with detailed information has been sent out by Nadine. ## **Trades and Technology (T&T) Committee Report** – Anne

- This is to be a "clean up year". A budget of \$636,000.00 has been allocated to finish various committee goals and objectives.
- Last year looked at incorporating T&T into the grade 8 science curriculum. Now looking at doing the same in grade 7.
- Last year money was given to grade 8 teachers for more equipment. More money will be given this year to grade 7 teachers.

- "Specialist High School Majors Programs" (SHSM) (Provincial program): Student would take 10 credits (as part of the 30 credits needed to graduate) over a span of 2 years, typically in grade 11 & 12. Student would receive a certificate on their graduation diploma specifying their specialist area. This is still a pilot project in Ontario.
- We now have 5 house building sites that are part of this specialist program. OCDSB has applied to the province for \$170,000. 00 to include the House Building and Manufacturing Tool and Dye programs as part of the SHSM. This program is being marketed as part of the Student Success Program.
