Meeting called to order: 7:10 p.m.

Initial comments from the chair:

- Parent appreciation reception that was supposed to be held this evening will be held at a later date due to the need for focus on the labour relations issue.
- In addition, cameras from CBC and journalists with Carleton University are also here observing the meeting tonight.

 - A Will need to look at the policies.
 - A Ability to fund equipment for extra-curricular like snowshoes if there is a teacher interested.

Presentation: Neil Yorke-Slader, (Superintendent of Instruction)

- o As of Monday, November 12, several bargaining units (secondary teachers, custodians, education assistants and office staff) have been in legal strike position.
- Expect elementary teachers to be in a similar position by late November, early December (17 days after Ministry's "No Board" report).
- Current impact examples secondary teachers not filling 'on calls' for supervisory situations (gym, library, cafeteria) and not inputting marks as of Monday November 12; elementary teachers are not attending staff meetings, not undertaking general duty (yard, cafeteria supervision).

- Results Principals and VPs filling gaps, parent volunteers, former Principals & VPs, allocation of central Principals to needs. Necessitates increased communication between Superintendent of Instruction and Principals.
- Board of Trustees approved a couple of motions this week: 1) allow Director of Education to close a school for a short period of time (for example, related to a safety issue); 2) plea to both parties to return to bargaining.
- Secondary School Report Cards some schools have already distributed report cards while others have the marks in hard copy, but they are not inputted into system. Deadlines Ontario Universities only need demographics at this point; Ontario Colleges will pull marks by November 26. Priority all report cards for Grade 12 students will be electronically entered by Friday November 23. For Grades 9-11 that did not have marks entered electronically by Friday November 9, report cards will not be issued at this time.

Comments from the floor

- Q What will be impact of the custodians going on strike?
 - A There are various levels of strike action. Currently have work to rule where employees are only
 doing the terms of their contracts (eg. No working on lunch break). In cases of real emergencies, staff
 will respond.
- Q Impact on Identification Placement and Review Committee (IPRC) process and Individual Education Plan (IEP)?
 - A IEPs were delivered to teachers at end of September therefore not a lot of review.
 - A Not a lot of IPRC meetings given current phase of annual cycle but will call one if needed.
- Q Has there been any reported conflict related to volunteers filling in for teachers at some of the extracurricular activities?
 - A No reported conflict.
- Q Related to the issue of ongoing teacher stress, is there currently greater absenteeism and therefore use of substitute teachers?
 - A No official data. Have needed to hire more substitute teachers to fill in for 'on call' gaps.
- Q What are the circumstances related to school closures?
 - A Principal must feel that there is a safety issue and this decision is not linked to financial savings.
 Intent is to close for only a short period of a day or two and then reopen. No schools closed to date.
 - A Examples further withdrawal of custodial services; young students do not have adequate supervision.
 - A At this time, do not know what services could be withdrawn if teachers move to the withdrawal of services action.
 - A Teachers will not be paid if there is a school closure.
 - A OCDSB's primary responsibility is to keep schools open.
 - A Depending on custodial situation, 3rd party day-cares could remain open.
- Q Will suspensions and expulsion rates be monitored?
 - A There is currently less supervision at HS level so potential exists and is being monitored.
- Q QUESTION RELATED TO MARKS
 - A Teachers continue to monitor, assess and evaluate students.
- Q QUESTION related to lock out?
 - A Government has this as a tool but key consideration will be whether the goal of this action produces the desired result.
- Q How are talks with Ministry going?

- A This is principally a provincial issue. OCDSB has offered to meet with any Federation or bargaining unit and Superintendents are communicating together frequently.
- Q Could you comment on the situation with a number secondary schools possibly not being able to maintain extracurricular activities, as they may be dependent on volunteers, and given that this is a key part of post-secondary applications?
 - A Teachers may still have a choice on extra-curricular activities and field trips.

Motion

As proposed by Chris Ellis, motion unanimously passed for OCASC Chair to send a letter to MPPs and Federation expressing concern over the current labour situation in schools and harm that is being done to children and a strong recommendation that negotiations recommence.
