

6. Chalk It Up



Q: Bells Corners Public School: Online Payments—Has anything heard anything about the system that the board was going to implement for online payments? Or what do other schools use for online payments?

A:

- Woodroffe—Hot lunches.ca, payments through paypal
 - Alta vista—use for volunteers
 - o Bridlewood—still do some manual bookkeeping, can be hard to keep track
 - Mapleridge—can set up schedules for field trips, etc. and there is a tutorial available
- Elgin—gave the administration of pizza back to the school, because it was too complicated for council
- · Dale—will talk to the school board
- Castlefrank—schools cash; worried about security issues

Q: Richmond Public School: How do parents top up school budgets? How do councils help with school supplies for teachers, etc.?

A:

- Woodroffe—designate a certain amount and hand it out to parents; we are allowed to raise funds for specific supplies
- Bridlewood—wishlist from the teachers; top up the supply teachers salaries
- Goulbourne—teachers have an extra allowance; regulations will not allow for classroom supplies
- Stittsville—allowance for teachers



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- Jockvale—gave each teacher a budget of \$100, and bought soccer balls
- Mary Honeywell—set aside \$500 as emergency supplies and made backpacks

Q: Richmond Public School: Balance between advocacy and fundraising; what do we do more of?

- A: Broadview—Council playing two roles "build a better Broadview
- Woodroffe—Advocacy: West End Review; PRO grants: joint events
- Mary Honeywell—Used to be advocacy, but since taking on the wish list, more fundraising; very imbalanced
- Agincourt—Accommodation review; didn't really take a stance (on this review, or on the kindergarten review), but now it's a very important issue
- Greenbank—with the West End Accommodation Review having such an impact on the school, fundraising will likely take a backseat to advocacy this year
- Elgin Street—There was a full turnover of parent council this year; will be doing lots of events for kids

Q: Broadview: Textile fundraiser—have schools held them and were they successful?

A:

- Woodroffe—Bag2School
- Paid per pound—Value Village—not terribly effective
- Longfields-Davidson—<u>Bag2School</u> (Saturday, 15 October 2016) all textiles and electronic recycling

Q: Glen Ogilvie: QSP (magazine) fundraiser

A:

- Adrienne Clarkson—Next killed QPS
- Knoxdale—bad service

Q: Woodroffe: Orange Shirt Day—What do people do?

A:

- Adrienne Clarkson—too late in the process
- Hilson—make sure that the dialogue is very open and sensitive
- Briargreen—just told today; teacher is reading a book about residential schools
- Elmdale—Resources for Orange Shirt day
- Churchill—Age appropriate; Indigenous theme day

Q: WE Gowling: Math Nights—What do people do?

- Mapleridge: Dr Marion Small talked the parents, and math kits were assembled; Possible resources: <u>Jump2Math</u> (they even have a <u>PRO grant template</u>); <u>The Right Angle</u>, Sunil Singh
- Elizabeth Park—used PRO grant to create Math kits
- Mary Honeywell—Mathletes did a math day; can't use PRO grant
- Bridlewood—Math night was organized by teachers—<u>Scientists in School</u> did a family night



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 Mapleridge—Mathletes don't do family math nights in Ottawa, but four scientists will put on a Scientists in School presentation for \$1,000

Mapleridge: Paul Davis will be doing an internet safety workshop at Mapleridge (in Orleans) on Thursday, 6 October 2016, at 7:00 p.m.

Q: Winston Churchill: Fundraising equity— Education foundation; consider giving one percent to Education foundation; left a poster to take back to council

A:

- Stittsville——talking about having a sister school
- Glashan—council gives every year
- · Adrienne Clarkson—great idea
- Knoxdale—has a sister school
- Mapleridge—Would be a good thing to bring up at the school council training day; talked about Education foundation; regularly meets with schools to help them help themselves – working with other schools
- Richmond—polarized in some schools, the sentiment is mixed
- Churchill—milk program helps provide milk to sister school
