4. Money Matters: Board Budget Cuts and School Council Finance with K. Gardner

- Accumulated surplus supporting overspending
- Looking at investments and drawing down accumulated surplus
- Working to balance the budget
- Kevin used the powerpoint presentation to give information about the budget.
 Note: The powerpoint presentation is included in the <u>February 2016 Meeting</u>
 Materials
- The upcoming meetings are listed at the end of the presentation. Delegations will be able to attend the meetings and raise concerns.

Questions and Answers:

Q: What concerns have already been voiced by parents and community?

A:

- Summer learning programs (for special needs). This is not a core or mandated program, but it is very important to parents and their concerns are being listened to.
- The changes to the French curriculum

Q: Is this a one-year process?

A: It is a multi-year challenge, but the solutions may also be multi-year.

Q: Earl of March - Will it affect the International Baccalaureate?

A: Not sure

Q: Goulburn: Is there a plan to market the board to international students?

A: Yes, through <u>OCENET</u> (Ottawa Carleton Education Network) - working to put students in different schools and grants for language training. Students pay a premium, and it does provide a small profit

Q: Are the budget meetings open to the public?

A: Yes, and more information is on the website

Q: Richmond: Where are salaries drawn from?

A: From the full \$850 million (\$750 is subject to 1% clawback)

Q: How can school space be used by the community?

A: Always in communication with schools

Q: Hopewell: Private public possibilities in Outdoor Education centres

A: Some revenue comes from other groups

Q: Would you accept help from the public and private sectors?

School Council finance guide (October 2014)

- · How to manage funds at the school council level.
- Many transitions challenge is to have continuity
- In the future, school council finances will be audited and a fundraising plan will be made
- School councils have sometimes been reluctant to share information with the board
- · Guide is for safeguarding assets
- Training will be easier

Q: A Lorne Cassidy ES: Where can I find it? A: In the <u>February 2016 Meeting Materials</u>

Q: Hopewell: Can we carry over funds? (specifically playgrounds)

A: If you are fundraising for a multi-year project, make sure you are very clear about the details.

Q: How is banking dealt with?

A: Work with principal if needed, but if there are enough volunteers, the council can do the banking.

Q: Castlefrank: Is banking through the school the best way?

A: Not necessarily, but using the same banking software would be useful

Q: A Lorne Cassidy ES: How do tax receipts work?

A: Work with school principal to find out if a receipt is warranted (\$25 min)

Q: Mutchmore: If council has a large sum of money that is earmarked for a particular project, can we put it in a high interest saving account.

A: Can hold money, but need to be very transparent with stakeholders

Q: Is there a limit to how much can be held? (e.g. for play structures)

A: There is no specific rule

Q: Are high interest accounts ok?

A: As long as it's a trusted financial institution

Q: Richmond: Could council set up an account for longer range projects (25 year playground projects)

A: It's a long timeframe and would be difficult to present it to the community - you would be expected to return it to the stakeholders

Q: Canterbury: Isn't most of it determined by CRA?

A: For tax receipts, yes. But for time lines, would have to clarify

Q: Is school council a registered charity?

A: Yes

Q: Online payments (Bells Corners PS): Has anyone successfully set it up?

- School cash suite is coming from the board, but currently there isn't a board sanctioned for in school fundraising and for school councils. There are security and confidentiality issues.

- Meadowlands: Concerns about confidentiality on hot lunches

Q: Outdoor classroom (Bells Corners PS): Fundraising done by school council. Who we talk to about using the funds?

A: Talk to the trustee

Q: Cheaper banking (WOM) - What do about service charges on cheques? Does the bank require two signatures?

A: Two signatories are required

Q: What about coins?

A:

- TD has a coin counter
- Don't use personal accounts
- · John Young: Can take the cash in bills and deposit in the council's account

Q: A Lorne Cassidy: Would councils get a break if they bank through the board? A: It would be something to be discussed - the board banks through Scotiabank
